



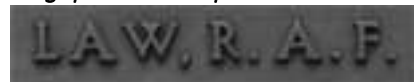

IRELAND'S MEMORIAL RECORDS 1914-1918

LAW, EDGAR. Regimental No. 1076. Rank, Private, 2nd Leinster Regiment; killed in action, France, August 25, 1916; born Hangerton, Wiltshire.

LAW, EDWARD MICHAEL FITZGERALD. Rank, Lieutenant, 1st Dorsetshire Regiment; killed in action, near Damery, France, August 11, 1918; age 20.

LAW, EDWIN. Regimental No. 2852. Rank, Private, Connaught Rangers, 1st Batt.; killed in action, France, April 26, 1915; born Croydon, Surrey.

LAW, ERNEST. Regimental No. 9228. Rank, Rifleman, Royal Irish Rifles, 15th Batt.; died, France, April 29, 1918; born Shankhill, Co. Antrim.

LAW, FRANK. Regimental No. 60807. Rank, Private, Northumberland Fusiliers (Tyneside Irish), formerly West Yorkshire Regiment; killed in action, France, April 16, 1917; born Mansfield, Nottinghamshire.

LAW, JAMES. Regimental No. 13050. Rank, Private, Royal Scots, 12th Batt.; killed in action, France, August 23, 1915; born Lisburn, Co. Antrim.

LAW, JAMES THOMAS. Reg. No. 592696. Rank, Private, 18th London Regiment (London Irish Rifles), formerly Middlesex Regiment; killed in action, France, August 19, 1917; born Hornsey.

LAW, JOHN. Regimental No. 1965. Rank, Private, Royal Munster Fusiliers, 2nd Batt.; killed in action, France, November 10, 1917; born Kūbarchan, Renfrew.

LAW, JOSEPH. Regimental No. 64055. Rank, Driver, Royal Engineers, 122nd Field Co.; died of wounds, France, March 20, 1917; born Shankhill, Co. Dublin.

LAW, ROBERT ARCHIBALD FITZGERALD. Rank, Captain, 7th Wiltshire Regiment; died of wounds, Rouen, October 31, 1918; age 21; decorations, M.C. with Bar, Mentioned in Despatches.
